# Study Guide: Why is baptism essential?

· What important truths are taught in this account of Jesus's baptism? (Matthew 3:13-1)



#### **Elder Robert D. Hales taught:**

"At baptism we make a covenant with our Heavenly Father that we are willing to come into His kingdom and keep His commandments from that time forward, even though we still live in the world.

"We are reminded from the Book of Mormon that our baptism is a covenant to 'stand as witnesses of God [and His kingdom] at all times and in all things, and in all places that ye may be in, even until death, that ye may be redeemed of God, and be numbered with those of the first resurrection, that ye may have eternal life' [Mosiah 18:9; emphasis added].

"When we understand our baptismal covenant and the gift of the Holy Ghost, it will change our lives and will establish our total allegiance to the kingdom of God. When temptations come our way, if we will listen, the Holy Ghost will remind us that we have promised to remember our Savior and obey the commandments of God" (Robert D. Hales, "The Covenant of Baptism: To Be in the Kingdom and of the Kingdom," Ensign, Nov. 2000, page 7).

Joseph Smith said: "You might as well baptize a bag of sand as a man, if not done in view of the remission of sins and getting of the Holy Ghost. Baptism by water is but half a baptism, and is good for nothing without the other halfthat is, the baptism of the Holy Ghost" (Teachings of Presidents of the Church: Joseph Smith, 95).




## CHRISTLIKE ATTRIBUTE ACTIVITY


